My professional field experience is an important source and inspiration for my academic work, enabling me to combine theory, research, teaching and learning with actual hands-on knowledge and insights gained from working closely with adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

It is my belief that the main challenges in providing the necessary supports to adults with disabilities is helping them identify their aspirations and needs, choose their individual paths in lifeway, and find the means to make their voices heard in order to achieve their goals.

For over 23 years, I have been involved in practice to help adults with disabilities to improve their quality of life. As a staff member at Kfar Tikva, a rural residential community for adults with disabilities, I initiated and directed several innovative programs, including a unique model of satellite apartments for adults with disabilities outside the sheltered environment to which they were accustomed. Another initiative I directed was the inclusion of adults with autism in Kfar Tikva's community, which, until then, had served primarily as a home for adults with cognitive disabilities.

I also participated in establishing a new center in Kfar Tikva in cooperation with the Magid Institute of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. The purpose was to develop knowledge and field training programs for the benefit of people with disabilities. This new center was the first in Israel to offer a program in psychotherapy in the area of cognitive and developmental disabilities. I also participated in the course, from which I obtained a Certificate in Integrative Psychotherapy.

Concurrently, I took a course at the University of Haifa to become a field instructor, and began supervising social work students in their field studies in the area of cognitive and developmental disabilities. Indeed, a couple of years later, while already a lecturer in the Zefat Academic College, department of social work, I introduced a new course of studies in the area of developmental disabilities, thereby contributing to the enrichment of social work studies by including the field of cognitive and developmental disabilities as an important area for theory development, research and professional knowledge.

During the years of my involvement with adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, I have come to realize how little knowledge service providers working in the field have. This gave me the incentive to return to academic studies and embark on my Ph.D. to help fill that gap.

In collaboration with Prof. Shunit Reiter, I initiated in Kfar Tikvah an academic center dedicated to conducting research and field studies with the goal of improving the quality of life of adults with disabilities. In addition to conducting international research, the center also holds conferences and disseminates professional publications in the field of adults with disabilities.

Future Plans:

My vision is to strengthen the links between theory and practice, and thereby improve interventions and support systems available to adults with disabilities. By conducting research, I plan to contribute to the development of theory regarding:

- The challenges facing adults with disabilities in their life course as adults;
- The designing of a holistic model of support for assisting individuals with disabilities to shape their own lives and experience meaningful life journeys.

Furthermore, I plan to expand on the implications of a humanistic orientation to:

- The role definition of support providers;
- The development of intervention programs;
- The professional training of students and support staff.
